National Park - an area of countryside, or occasionally sea or fresh water, protected by the government for the enjoyment of the general public or the preservation of wildlife.

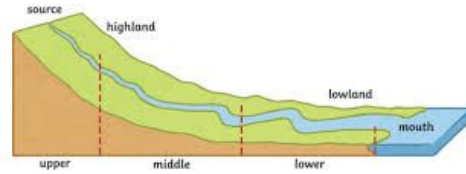
Physical features - are natural e.g. rivers, mountains

Upland - an area of high or hilly land.

I can name features of a river.

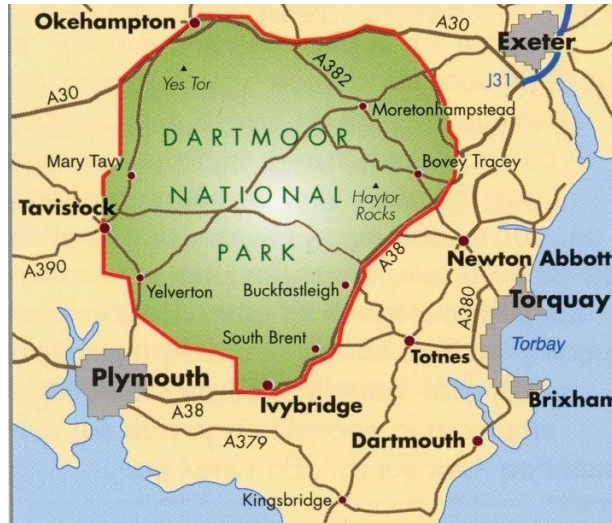


Key Facts:
