

Geography

Linked to our English text, which is set in the Texan desert, the children will explore the geographical features of North America. They will also have the opportunity to compare these features to the U.K.

DT

We will make festive 3D pop up cards, ready to sell at the Christmas Fair.

Mathematics

Continuing on from last term, we will be learning about multiplication and division, with a focus on long division and the order of operations. We will also move on to our fractions unit. This unit will recap our learning from Year 5 and introduce new calculations using fractions. This will include multiplying fractions with fractions and dividing.

PSHE

In PSHE this term, we will be celebrating differences between us. We will consider what 'normal' means and how 'being different' can affect someone's life. We will also look at 'bullying' and how to overcome situations.

RE

This term our key question is, 'How does faith help people when life gets hard?' First, we will explore what gratitude is and what we are thankful for in our lives. Then, we will look at different religious beliefs about life and death.

Science

In science this term, the children will focus on evolution and inheritance. They will identify how animals have adapted to suit their environment and explore what we learn from fossils.

This term the children will be creating a self-expressive pattern about a chosen topic. This will be inspired by different artists.

English

This term, our English will focus on the story 'Holes' by Louis Sachar. The children will create setting descriptions of the desert focusing on expanded noun phrases, adverbial openers and similes. Our grammar focus will include: colons, semi colons, active and passive voice and formal language.

History

In our history lessons, the children will be exploring crime and punishment through the ages. They will discuss how punishments have changed, why this is and what this can show us about society. They will also have the opportunity to put themselves in the position of a Victorian prisoner and consider what their life would have been like.
